SUBJECT: I-95 Temporary Livestock Inspection Site

With the I-95 Agricultural Interdiction Station currently under construction, we estimate that we will be temporarily closing the station on or about August 10, 2010, for approximately two months.

During the closure, the Office of Agricultural Law Enforcement (OALE) will temporarily set up operations to inspect all incoming shipments of livestock at the Department of Transportation (DOT) Weigh in Motion (WIM) Station, located at mile marker 377, 4.1 miles south of the Agricultural Interdiction Station on I-95. We will also provide temporary livestock inspection at exit 380 (US 17), located 1.2 miles south of the interdiction station.

DOT will have signage directing the livestock traffic into the WIM station for agricultural inspection. After entering the WIM station, additional signage will direct the transporter to a designated parking area where an OALE officer will complete the inspection process in the usual manner.

This temporary process is designed to provide interrupted protection to the livestock industry during construction.
