2007 – 2008 PROCESSOR COMPLIANCE AGREEMENT

Dear Citrus Processor:

The Florida Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services has revised the Citrus Health Response Program Compliance Agreements and Business Plans and is in the process of releasing the documents for the 2007 - 2008 citrus harvesting season. The language in the forms has been changed to an extent in an effort to better serve the current needs of the citrus industry.

The new Processor Compliance Agreement, which can be identified by the ID Number, "CA\_PROC-DR78F," is now available on the Department's website and through any State Program Field Office. In addition to signing a compliance agreement, the completion and submittal of a business plan that outlines each processor's internal citrus canker decontamination plan is required. Please note that sections of the business plan other than decontamination may be left blank by processors, as these pages apply only to growers and caretakers. Both the new compliance agreement and business plan forms may be downloaded and printed from the State's website, and may be mailed or faxed to the Division of Plant Industry (FDACS/DPI), 3027 Lake Alfred Road, Winter Haven, FL 33881; Fax# 863-291-5219. Please be aware that the new processor compliance agreement regulations become effective as of November 19, 2007, and must be completed along with a business plan and be returned to the Florida Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services/ Division of Plant Industry/ CHRP headquarters in Winter Haven by December 31, 2007.

The Department intends to monitor compliance to determine the level of industry participation, while helping to safeguard the welfare of the citrus industry. Working closely with Florida's Citrus Industry, we can together determine suitable measures that will allow for profitable citrus production while keeping citrus canker and greening diseases in check.
