- 1) *Achatina fulica*, giant African land snail. Note characteristic inward curl of shell. **If suspected, call helpline.**
- 2) *Caracolus marginella*, the banded caracol, an uncommon introduced species.
- 3) *Zachrysis provisoria*, the Cuban land snail, an occasional pest.
- 4) *Liguus fasciatus*, the Florida tree snail, a native beneficial snail, cleans trees.
- 5) *Orthalicus reses*, the Stock Island tree snail, a native beneficial snail, found mostly in the Keys.
- 6) *Orthalicus floridensis*, the banded tree snail, our largest native land snail (~7 cm), is beneficial by cleaning trees.
- 7) *Drymaeus multilineatus*, the many-lined tree snail, a native beneficial snail, cleans trees.
- 8) *Bulimulus guadeloupensis*, the Guadeloup snail, an introduced species, not a pest, cleans surfaces
- 9) *Pomacea* spp., apple snails, which are aquatic. *Pomacea paludosa* is a native, other exotic species can be pests.
- 10) *Euglandina rosea*, the rosy wolf snail, a predator of other snails.
